Discussion Notes

How to work together as a Cooperative to manage patron holds.

- We do not have a best practice to coordinate this effort at this time.
- Do libraries purchase the newest and most popular?
- Are purchases made based on patrons' suggestions?

What criteria are BG libraries using to make acquisition decisions?

- LOM - Top 50 holds list?
- SM – Top 50 holds, NYT, Reese Witherspoon. Purchase 5 to 1, holds to holdings; and 3 to 1 for authors like Grisham and Patterson.
- SP – doesn't purchase based on holds since their patrons don't tend to use the holds feature
- SP -- has McNaughton leased collection – reservable only for SP patrons
- LOM – no PO the first few months of the FY so only Amazon purchases can be made during this time
- PR – purchases best-selling authors from NYT

What is the most # of copies a library would consider purchasing for the most popular titles?

PR – DVD's are out-circulating Adult non-fiction

What is the system that libraries use to pre-purchase upcoming titles?

- Eric has used Author Express at previous library (Teresa will research this for Koha)
- Inform vendors to automatically send specific authors
- Teresa will provide list of URL's for various resources to upcoming and popular titles

If at least one library purchases a title 3 months in advance and/or we enter dummy records in order to allow holds to be placed even if an item is not available yet. This is a helpful tool to determine how many copies a library might want to purchase.

What kinds of titles are on hold?

Fill rate is too low – only 44% ---

- NOTE: BG has since analyzed historic #'s and the Koha reported #'s and determined that the numbers reported were inaccurate. The report had an error in logic. The actual fill rate is 83%. Black Gold will report fill rate every month in the circ reports going forward.

How can we get faster turns on the newest/best sellers?

- Stop auto renewals. Selena mentioned that years ago we did not allow auto renewals at all. But, one of the past members had wanted it so the other libraries agreed.
- Set up a new item type with shorter circ rules
 - 1 week instead of 3
 - No auto renewals
 - When would the item go back to normal circ rules?
 - How would this be maintained in Koha? - Manually?
 - BG can research options
- Make the title not holdable
 - How long would it stay in this status?
 - When would the item go back to normal circ rules?
 - How would this be maintained in Koha? - Manually?
 - BG can research options
- Move holds off of hold shelves faster
 - Set up a new system of communication where text notifications can be answered—if a patron no longer wants the item, they can “Opt out” or say “no”. Unique has a feature to do this—BG will research this.
 - How many books are not picked up, but just go back to the shelves or to the next person on hold?
 - What is the average # of days a book is on the hold shelf before being picked up?
 - Holds do not expire out of Koha automatically?
- Can we have a different length of check out period per library?
- Can we have different hold times for each library?
